Christ Church Primary School PE and Sport Vision Statement

At Christ Church Primary School, we believe that Physical Education and Sport play a vital role in the physical, social, emotional and intellectual development of children. Physical Education and sport are central in giving children the knowledge and understanding in order to make a positive impact on their own health and well-being. The physical education curriculum at Christ Church aims to provide children with the opportunity to take part in a range of sports and physical activities, carried out in a safe and supportive environment, where effort and hard-work, as well as success, is celebrated.

- Competent pupils able to excel in a broad range of physical activities
- Pupils have the ability to be physically active for sustained periods of time
- Pupils to be able to engage in competitive sports and activities
- Pupils to be supported to lead healthy and active lifestyles
- Pupils have the opportunity to be involved in sports leadership

Sports Premium 2022/23

The primary 'sport premium' funding for primary schools has been designed to help schools in a variety of ways. Some of the outcomes we hope to meet through the 'sport premium' are:

- Improvements in the quality and breadth of PE and sporting provision, including 'increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of'
- Improved quality of teaching and learning in primary physical education, including more dynamic and sustained exercise in lessons
- Increased opportunities for competitive sport
- Increased sports leadership for pupils
- Develop the range of sporting activities offered
- Foster links with local sporting clubs

How the Sports Premium is being used at Christ Church (July 2023)

- Providing coaches from local clubs for after school sports clubs to improve 'Pupil Engagement' and providing opportunities for exciting physical activities after school. This allows pupils to have access to a range of after school activities linked to a variety of sports (**£3375**)
- Buying into the 'East Staffs School Sports Partnership'. This provides us with access to high quality training, advice and provision for PE (**£1500**)
- Continuing to pay annual subscription for Complete PE to key up with latest PE initiatives and use the online assessment tool (**£265**)
- Buying new equipment to improve the number of resources within the school. Allowing the children to have access to high quality resources will improved their attitudes towards PE and help staff to deliver quality lessons (**£2173**)

- Ensuring PE equipment is meeting Health and Safety requirements Inspection (**£195**) and Repairs (**£3272**)
- Scooter training for Y2 (June 2023) (**£450**)
- New Cycle Shelter (**£1105**)

Impact of the Sports Premium at Christ Church

- A wide variety of after school clubs run by Burton Albion from reception to Y6. A club takes place every Monday and Wednesday after school.
- The East Staffs School Partnership provides opportunities for training for staff as well as virtual competitions for pupils to participate in. Staff have received online training via Zoom and Microsoft Teams
- New equipment for has been purchased for football, netball and rounders after a staff survey, which has allowed teachers to teach more effectively
- Complete PE Scheme continues to be used effectively, including using online assessment tool and activity tracker
- Disadvantaged pupils have enjoyed developing their sporting skills during the summer holiday
- All equipment meets Health and Safety requirements, enabling teachers to deliver PE effectively with sufficient resources
- The school maintained their School Games Mark Gold Award status which was awarded in June 2023.

Swimming Outcomes 2022-23

All Y3 and Y4 children attended swimming lessons at the Meadowside Leisure Centre since September 2022 and were taught by swimming teachers in differentiated groups. Travel to the pool and the cost of lessons is paid for by the school.

The number of current Y6 pupils meeting the national curriculum requirement to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25m is 25/42 (59.52%); using a range of strokes effectively is 24/43 (55.81%) and performing safe self-rescue in different water-based situations is 18/43 (41.86%) for the 2022-23 academic year.

Reporting

The Headteacher will report to governors on the impact of sports funding annually and the report will be on the school website for parents to view.
